CONFERENCE ON WASTE REDUCTION SLATED FOR THREE LOCATIONS MARCH 19-21, 1990 For Immediate Release March 5, 1990

The Georgia Tech Research Institute and Georgia Department of Natural Resources will sponsor a three-day conference on waste reduction March 19-21 at three locations: Atlanta, Macon and Savannah.

The conference, part of a national program carried by satellite to the three locations, is designed for industry representatives, state and local government officials, emergency planners and other professionals. Technical professionals will be on hand at each location to lead local programs.

Topics will include developing and implementing waste reduction programs, regulatory trends affecting hazardous and solid waste, steps which can be taken to reduce waste disposal costs, and ways to reduce liabilities associated with wastes. The program will originate at the University of Tennessee Center for Industrial Services.

The program will run from 11 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. each day, with a registration fee of \$90. Program sessions will be held at Macon College on Eisenhower Parkway in Macon, the Coastal Georgia Center for Continuing Education on West Broad Street in Savannah, and at the Energy Planning Center in Technology Park, Norcross, which is north of Atlanta.
